Therapeutic, Transition & Vocation Link

Accotink Academy is a full time special education therapeutic day school. While focusing on individualized education, it is also realized that transition readiness and vocational development are crucial components to the success of our students.

In order to best prepare students for postgraduation plans, vocational and transition offerings utilize a multidisciplinary approach emphasizing therapeutic supports (psychological, art, speech and language and occupational therapies) and appropriate accommodations dependent on the student's educational needs.

CORPS OF CADETS

- The course introduces leadership training by defining positive self-concepts and develops basic managerial skills by providing practical applications of leadership.
- The course teaches oral communication, wearing of uniform and participation in ceremonies similar to a military setting.



BARBERING

- The class introduces students to barbering.
- Students study the history of barbering, shop management, ethics and social skills, hygiene, sanitation, and sterilization.
- "Hands-on" activities include draping, use of implements and basic haircutting techniques.
- Students learn business skills and study materials for their barbering exams should they want to pursue this career.



SMALL ENGINE REPAIR

- Students learn the basics of two-stroke and fourstroke engine technology.
- They learn the diagnosis and repair of combustion engines and simple electrical circuitry.
- Students will be able to disassemble, reassemble and replace engine components.
- This course prepares students interested in a career in small engine repair industries like motorcycles, boat and gardening equipment. Students follow studies toward a Technician's certificate .



FASHION, CLOTHING AND TEXTILES

- Focuses on standards of quality in hand and commercially made clothing, personal appearance, wardrobe budgeting, fashion and clothing construction.
- Hands-on activities include basic sewing techniques by hand or machine, identifying fabrics and using commercial patterns to construct garments.



CULINARY ARTS

- Students train in all aspects of food safety and preparation for ServSafe certification.
- Students are introduced to beginning culinary skills and kitchen basics.
- Students learn how food becomes unsafe and how to ensure food safety throughout the flow of operation systems.
- Students learn how to prevent accidents and injuries.



MUSIC PRODUCTION

- The music production course allows students to explore the basic skills and career avenues of the recording industry.
- The course focuses on recording engineering, which is the process of operating recording equipment/software and mixing audio.
- Students compose, arrange and produce music.
- Students will learn the necessary skills using audio production software, music production hardware and instruments.




HEALTH CAREERS

- Health careers provides student with core knowledge and skills common to all health occupations.
- It also provides an introduction to health care, health care facilities, and to members of the health professions teams.
- Students gain insight through field trips, resource personnel, portfolios and projects, interviewing and job shadowing.
 - Topics of discussion include establishing the basis for wellness; ethics in health care,

universal precautions (protection from diseases), health issues (medical care access and coverage, delivery systems, financing), and select medical terminology.









I.T. ESSENTIALS

- Students will learn the fundamentals of computer hardware and software.
- They will be able to describe the internal components of a computer, assemble a computer system, install an operating system, and troubleshoot using system tools and diagnostic software. Topics include laptops and portable devices, wireless connectivity, security, safety, and environmental issues.
- Hands-on lab activities are an essential element of the course.
- This course prepares students for CompTIA A+ certification if they choose a computer
